Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This year has been unlike any other. It has brought about changes in pretty much every aspect of our lives. We've had changes in worship, grocery shopping, doctor visits, work, and so much more. It changed how we celebrated holidays, especially how we celebrated Easter earlier this year. It's changed how we interact with others leading to zoom meetings instead of meeting in-person, FaceTime calls instead of personal visits, and on and on the list could go.

With so much changing around us, it is good to know that one thing remains constant. The Scriptures assure us, *"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."* -Heb. 13:8

With everything changing in the world around us, one thing remains constant: our Savior, Jesus Christ. His love for us has not changed. The peace He gives through His own death and resurrection will not change. Some things may change: how we worship, where we meet, how we meet, who we meet with. But God's truth remains constant.

His love for us is constant. His forgiveness continues to be extended to us each and every day. The truth that Jesus was born for you and for me, that truth we celebrate each year at Christmas, has not changed and will not change no matter how the world around us may change. The blessed hope of the resurrection remains constant for us as God's beloved children. For we have been washed in the waters of Baptism. We have been received into God's family, adopted as His own children. We have been promised an eternal inheritance that will never fade. None of this will change. Isaiah puts it quite well when he writes, *"The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever."* -Is. 40:8 God's Word of truth, life, forgiveness, and salvation stands forever. This Word stands. And though everything around us may be changing, God remains our constant. With that

in mind as we approach our Christmas celebration, some things may be changing, but one thing remains the same: The love God has shown us in sending His Son Jesus to be born for you and for me remains the same. Worship will continue to be live streamed and as we begin mid-week services, these too will be streamed online Wednesdays at 7:00pm.

As I'm sure you've heard, our children's Christmas program is the thing experiencing the biggest change. As of this writing, the plan is for the children to pre-record all the parts of the Christmas Eve Children's Program. These recordings will be compiled into videos that will be played during our Christmas Eve services. We will have two services to accommodate social distancing with a greater number of people. Our first service will be for those who are higher risk. We will be increasing the distance between pews, we are requiring everyone in attendance to be masked throughout the service, and we are asking anyone planning on attending this service to pre-register by either contacting the church or through a link that will be made available on our church Facebook page.

The second service will have precautions similar to our regular Sunday services. Every other pew will be blocked off, we still recommend masks, but will not require them, and no pre-registration will be required. In an attempt to accommodate everyone, we will have distanced seating available in the overflow and balcony, and should the need arise, we will have a video stream of the service playing in the fellowship hall where there will be additional seating. Finally, at the end of this service, we will invite any Sunday school children in attendance to come forward and sing a few songs in front of the congregation.

In all this it is our goal to make it possible for as many people as we can to come and be a part of our Christmas celebration. The good news of Christ Jesus

born for all stands forever. No virus can take this good news away from us. And though how we gather may change, whether you choose to join us at either of these services or to join us virtually. God's love for us all remains the same. May that love sustain us amid all life's changes.
