Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With our Thanksgiving celebrations fresh in our minds, I imagine many of you have ideas of some of the many blessings God has given you over the past year. These blessings lead us then to give thanks to God, because we recognize Him as the giver of all good things. I am reminded of the hymn, "How Can I Thank You, Lord" where we sing of the great things God has done for us: bearing with us in our sins, bringing us to faith, giving us joy as God shows us the way of salvation. The song concludes with the request that God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, lead us to adore Him, serve Him, and ultimately be welcomed into His eternal kingdom. Because of the many blessings we have, we are led to praise, adore, and serve our loving God.

So how do we do these things? We praise God with our voices. Whether that is through psalms, spoken words of "alleluia" or "praise the Lord", or songs of praise we sing together. We show our adoration through our gifts brought to God in loving obedience, but also through loving service in many different ways.

When I was in high school, one of my teachers had a phrase that he would repeat when asked about our purpose on Earth as God's children. He would say that we, "love and serve God by loving and serving others." Yes, we can serve God through our attendance in worship. We can serve Him through our tithes and offerings. But as Jesus told us in the parable of the sheep and the goats,

"the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'" Matt. 25:40

Our service to our neighbor is service to God because it is what God has called us to do.

God has called us to serve one another in love. St Paul talks about this idea of serving one another in terms of a body, referring to the church as the "body of Christ." A body isn't made up exclusively of hands or just feet or

just eyes. Each member of the body has a function that serves the rest of the body. The nose smells, the eyes see, the ears here, the hands touch. So it is with the body of Christ. God equips each of us differently and so St Paul comes to the conclusion,

"God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another." 1 Cor. 12:24a-25

With that in mind, there are so many different ways that we as God's children can serve Him in His house. You can serve by helping to clean God's house. You can serve by assisting with funerals or helping with worship by ushering. You can serve by joining a board or committee or helping out with a program like VBS or the Christmas Program. You can serve by joining the prayer chain and lifting up others in prayer. You can serve by volunteering to drive pastor around. And there are countless other ways you can serve the Lord based on the gifts He has given.

God has blessed us greatly through His Son, Jesus Christ. Forgiven, redeemed, and looking forward to the promise of eternal life with Him, we in thanksgiving serve our Lord. And so I encourage you this holiday season, as you recall the great gift God has given us in sending Christ to be born for us. Consider with the hymn writer, "How can I thank You, Lord?" For God has built us together into the body of Christ. We have been gifted in so many different ways. Let us use our gifts to bring praise and honor to His name. Let us "love and serve God, by loving and serving others." To that end I encourage you to consider where you can serve as a member of the body of Christ. That together we might ask, as we do every Sunday in the singing of the offertory, "What shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits to me?" May God continue to bless you with His love and grace this holiday season.

Memorial Service was held on November 11, 2021 for Norma Jean Buschmann who was called to her eternal home on November 7, 2021.


Graveside Service was held on November 12, 2021 for Delbert E. Olson who was called to his eternal home on October 30, 2021.
