Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As summer comes upon us, I see more and more folks out there tending their gardens. I see the gardens growing and flourishing. And what a joy it is to see things growing as they are! As we move into the season of summer, our church transitions into a new season as well. June typically marks the beginning of the Sundays after Pentecost.

As we consider the growing of our gardens, our crops, and our grass, for those of you who enjoy mowing, we also consider our growth as God's children. When you tend a field, when you care for a garden, even when it's just a lawn of grass, it takes care and attention to make it grow the way you want it to. Plants need to be pruned and trimmed. Weeds need to be pulled. The plants need to be watered so they can continue to grow and thrive. There's fertilizer to put down and so much more. We take such care with growing our crops. We watch, we tend, and we wait. And of course there is also prayer. We pray for good weather, we pray for a good yield, and we trust God to care for us and for our crops.

As you consider all the time and attention we put in to growing things this time of year. Consider the time and attention God has put into growing your faith. One of my favorite passages of Scripture is found in Isaiah 55. There God tells us,

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it." - Is. 55:10-11

God waters us with His Word, so that we may grow and develop to be the fruitful plants He has created us to be.

In Amos 9:15, God promised the people of Israel he would plant them in a good place.

In Jeremiah 17, God tells us,

"Blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD. He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit."

- Jer. 17:7-8

Our trust in God is like a river of water from which our roots can draw deeply so that we can stand strong and tall even in the midst of the worst of times.

Finally Jesus himself tells us He is the vine and we are the branches. We grow in Him. We bear fruit in Him alone. God the vine-dresser prunes us, that we may continue to bear fruit for Him. He tends to us with the utmost of care. More carefully and more perfectly than any of us could tend our gardens or our fields. And as we consider this divine care God gives to us, we recall the promise Jesus gave that as the Father has cared for the fields, clothing them in beautiful flowers, giving them rain in due season, He cares for and tends to us even more lovingly.

As June begins and summer rolls in, remember how God cares for you. He waters you with His Word, giving you the nourishment you need to bear fruit for Him. Yes at times He may have to prune away some, and that may not always be the most pleasant of experiences, but He prunes and cares for us that we may bear fruit for Him and that we may continue to serve Him in all we say and do. May God continue to bless you that you may be His fruitful tree, bearing the fruit of the Spirit as God waters you each new day with His Word and Spirit.

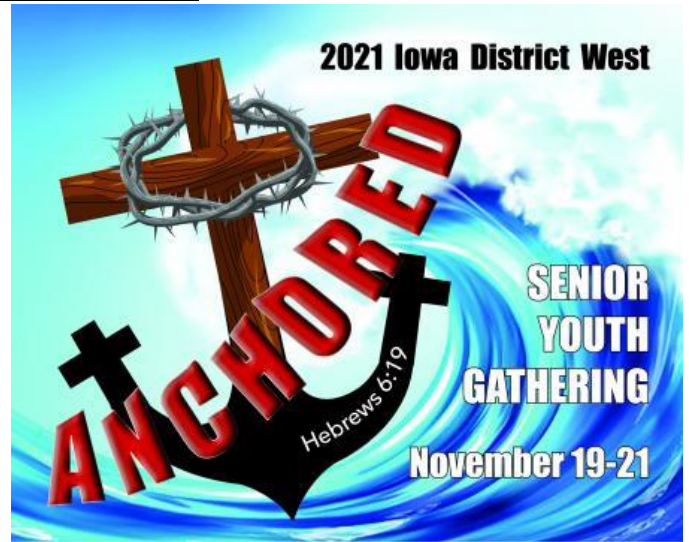

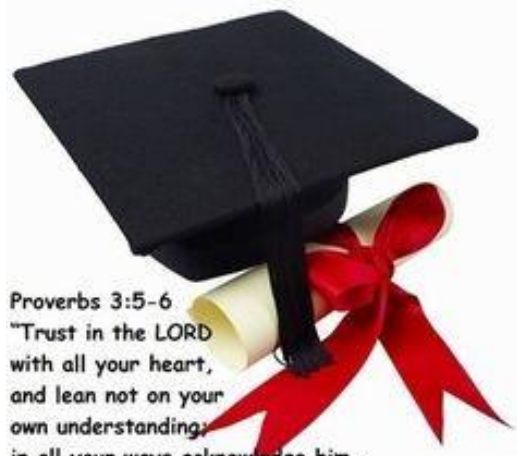

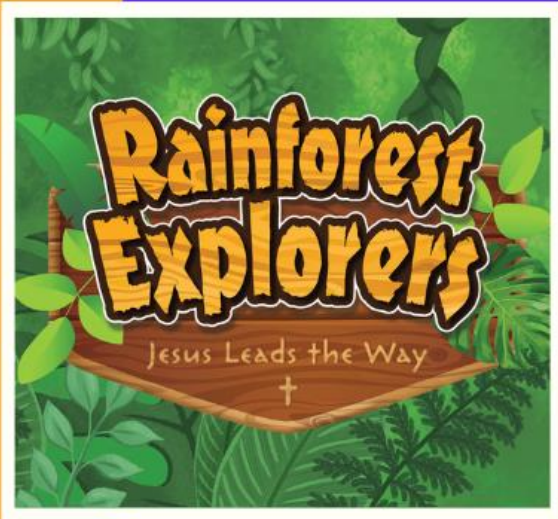
