

Date: November 17-19, 2023 Topic: Ready, Set, Go Theme Verse: Matt 28:19-20a The meeting opened with prayer, and the minutes of the previous 04/16/23 guarterly meeting and the 05/14/23 and 07/02/23 special voters meetings were printed out for everyone to read. Motion carried to approve the minutes. Deanna was not in attendance, but the Treasurer's Report for 04/01/23-06/30/23 was on printouts for everyone to review. The Front Steps Fund will be moved to help pay for the sidewalk concrete project, and the 1998 Ministry Fund will be disbursed in August to the Endowment Fund in St. Louis. Motion carried to approve the Treasurer's Report. Pastor reported that he confirmed three students in May, and he was the devotion leader for Cub Week at Camp Okoboji the last week in June. Our VBS is starting today, and St. Matthew's VBS was held last week. Wednesday Bible Class and shut-in visits are continuing, and Pastor hopes to start the Sunday morning Bible study in the near future. Matthew Harrison was reelected as President of the LCMS. Attendance figures for June were given. Six members transferred in, one transferred out, a Baptism was held earlier in the spring, and another Baptism will be held in a couple of weeks. A couple of people are interested in attending a new member class. The elders deferred some of their work on constitutional changes to prioritize St. Matthew's. The trustees got the new camera system installed and will get three rooms in the church painted this week. The concrete project went over the estimate approximately \$2,000.00, and a concrete pad was installed at the parsonage for \$1,125.00, so the total cost was around \$8,200.00. Pastor was willing to pay for the pad but the trustees recommended that the church pay for that, and discussion was held with a motion made and carried that the church pay the total bill and overage. John Greder will talk to Deanna about moving the balance of the step fund to the memorial fund. The trustees were waiting for estimates and contractors, so they had nothing yet to report on the roof repair. A motion was made and carried to get the ash trees treated. VBS starts tonight and continues through Wednesday with a meal and activities at the park. The 2023-2024 Sunday School curriculum has been selected, and the teacher and helper signup sheets were reviewed by the Board of Ed. They will continue to review the situation, and there is a possibility of not having Sunday School when there are no volunteers. The board hopes to have the Sunday School kids come up with items to put in the new time capsule. The time capsule was discussed, and a motion was made and carried for the church to pay for the vault and stone with a cap of \$1,000.00. Pastor Wolfram from Lutheran Family Services was here May 28 and \$620.00 was collected. The 125th Committee is able now to pay back the \$1,000.00 seed money to the congregation, and since the treasurer was not in attendance Gary McCall handed the check to Pastor. Printouts of the upcoming events were handed out. The 125th Committee asked permission of the congregation to display the contents of the time capsule at the Ute Town and Country building during the celebration there on 8/20/23, and to display artifacts and historical documents in the Sunday School rooms the evening of the capsule opening. Motion was made and carried. Special features will be in the Press, and the church float has been prepared. Tshirts are available to order as a fundraiser for the church. The updated contact information for the directory is being entered in the software and everything will be sent to the printer, so the directories are expected to be ready by the end of the month. A special voters meeting was held July 2 giving Pastor permission to continue being St. Matthew's vacancy pastor until the end of the year and to be the SMP supervising pastor for John Stacy. Pastor spoke briefly about what will be happening at St. Matthew's. Randy Fowser from St. Louis Seminary will be here August 13. The last funds in the 1998 Ministry Fund are maturing, and we hope to have a check ready for Randy that day to add to our endowment fund at St. Louis. Randy Fowser and President Turner will meet sometime and discuss if John Stacy could be eligible to use some of our fund. Some discussion was held on the Care Committee. If anyone knows of someone who needs help, they should get in touch with Pastor and he will contact the committee. The Sunday School Superintendent position still is vacant, and Pastor spoke on the idea discussed at council of having the person elected in January but not starting the position until the Sunday School year starts. The next Council meeting will be August 15, and the next voters meeting will be October 15. A motion to adjourn was made and carried. Pastor led the voters in praying the Lord's Prayer.
