Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Coming up this February 14, we have a rather odd pairing of holidays. As I'm sure you're all aware, February 14 is traditionally Valentine's Day. And of course, we all know this as a day set aside to celebrate love. People give flowers, and hearts are the common symbol for the day.

What makes this year unique is that February 14 is also Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is a day set aside to remember our sinfulness, our guilt over sin, our shame. Instead of flowers, we are given ashes. Instead of the symbol of a heart we have the symbol of a cross placed upon our foreheads. Instead of "be my valentine", we are told, "you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent, a time usually designated for repentance and reflection as we consider our sinfulness and our need for the savior God sent to the cross for us. These 40 days of Lent are a time for us to consider how as St Paul tells us,

"for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus," - Rom. 3:23-24

We remember our unworthiness before God as we consider His commands and our failure to keep them all, that we might be driven back to the cross. Sent to the one place where we can find God's grace and mercy held out to us lovingly and freely.

It may be odd from a symbols and statements point of view to share Ash Wednesday with Valentine's Day, But from God's perspective it makes perfect sense. We are reminded that we are dust, we are reminded of our sinful state, and we are reminded of our need for the savior. However, each one of these reminders drives us back to the love of God shown for us in Christ Jesus. St Paul reminds us of this love in his epistle to the romans: "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." -Rom. 5:8

While we were still sinners Christ died for us. He didn't die for us because we were the perfect children, but because of His love for us and our need for His salvation.

The Bible gives us so many examples of God's great love for us. Many of them are centered around our need for His salvation. The most familiar being one I may not even need to cite here for you, John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." God loves His world. He loves you, His children, whom He created from dust. He loves you and I, sinful though we are. And so throughout this lenten season, as we remember our sinfulness, our shame, our guilt, may we also remember that it was for these very reasons that Christ came, suffered, and died. And through His resurrection we have the promise of His eternal love. Though we will return to dust He will raise us at the last that we may live in His love forevermore. So may your February 14 be filled with reminders of God's love, even as we remember our need for that love in Christ. Blessed Lent to you all,

January 21, 2024, Voters Meeting Recap

Chairman John Greder and Head Elder Bruce Mohr were not in attendance, and Pastor met with the elders that were present. Motion made and carried that Elder Gary McCall head the meeting. Pastor had an opening prayer. Motion made and carried to accept the agenda. The minutes of the previous 10/15/2023 meeting and the 12/17/2023 special voters meeting were printed out for everyone to read. Motion made and carried to approve the minutes as presented. Ballots were passed out and everyone voted on the slate of candidates for 2024. The Treasurer's Report for 2023 was presented. Motion carried to approve the Treasurer's Report. Pastor reported that the Advent services went well despite his Covid during the first week, with the elders stepping up to help out, and Bruce Mohr led the church service on December 10. John Stacy handled St. Matthew's Advent services this year. The Mapleton elders wish to discuss Lenten and Holy Week services with St. Paul's elders soon. February 4-8, 2024, Pastor and John Stacy will be in St. Louis for the SMP program orientation. Catechism classes and the mid-week and Sunday adult Bible classes are going well. Pastor and elders are working on better tracking shut-in visits, and everyone was asked to let Pastor know if they are aware of any shut-ins. The livestreaming of services on Facebook is going better with the new equipment and having written instructions for the order of turning on the various parts. The election results were ready, but there was a tie for the Chairman position, so paper ballots were passed out for another vote on that office. Official attendance figures were not available with Bruce Mohr's absence, but Gary McCall said the attendance is close to the five-year average. The Christmas Eve service had 230 in attendance, and there is an average of approximately a dozen on-line viewers weekly. The elders will be focusing on membership and reaching out to infrequent attendees this year, as well as working through a book on the responsibilities and duties expected of elders. They are continuing to monitor the effects of St. Matthew's vacancy on Pastor and the congregation. Election results: Elder-Steve Gust. Trustee-Deigo Mordhorst. Education-Tena Bernholtz. Chairman-Matt Leitz. Recording Secretary-Audrey Gust. Treasurer-Deanna Sorensen. Stewardship Secretary-Tammy Bramley. Auditing Committee-Dave Seieroe, Terri Mohr, Mariah Nutt. Endowment Fund-Terri Mohr. Finance Committee-Marc Clemon, Gwen Clemon, Becky Mordhorst, Danny Mordhorst, Linda Riddle, Dave Seieroe, Linda Seieroe, John Thies, Terri Mohr, Bruce Mohr, Elaine Vogt, Harvey Thies. Installation of officers will be in two weeks, on February 4. Motion was made and carried to approve the trustees' recommendation of gifting the old amplifier from our old PA system to the Ute Town and Country Building. The trustees are continuing to be in contact with the insurance company regarding the roof, and they will keep the congregation informed as it develops. A \$23,000.00 check from the insurance company was received and deposited. Sunday School is continuing as planned, and more people are needed to sign up to be teachers/helpers in future months. Jesus's Birthday Party was held December 10, and thanks from the board of education were expressed to all who helped or participated in the Christmas Eve Children's Program. The envelopes for 2024 are in and labeled and ready to go, and the finance committee schedule for 2024 is ready. The 2024 Special Mission Project is Lutheran Braille Workers, and Tammy Bramley and Pastor will reach out to have a representative come to speak this year. The trustees can be contacted regarding the old tables that are available for a donation to the church. Ronnie Kroll, Kerri Lane, Deanna Sorensen, and Angie Kroll were the winners of the drawing for the four church spires. Gary McCall reported that the Jeremiah Fund Advisory Committee met, and the committee is up and functioning and will meet again soon to review guidelines and discuss the 125th Anniversary donation that was received. A motion was made and carried to take \$1,736.00 from the general fund to apply to the 2023 Mission Budget. \$6,000.00 had been pledged, while only \$4,264.00 was received. Everyone was encouraged to invite others to attend church with us. A motion to adjourn was made and carried, and Pastor closed with a prayer.
