**February 2026**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter the month of February, Later this month I imagine many of you will take some time to celebrate a particular holiday, and while this month does feature the beginning of Lent and the observances of Ash Wednesday, I'm thinking more of Valentine's Day. Valentine's is a day generally set aside to celebrate love and with that in mind, today I urge you to consider what the Bible has to say about love.

The word love can be found over 500 times in the Scriptures. When asked about the greatest commandment Jesus sums up all of God's law with two short commands, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." And... "a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Matthew 22:37, 39 And were we to summarize both of these we could easily break it down to just love.

We are called to be God's people reflecting back His love for us and showing His love to our neighbor. In Luke's gospel we hear as Jesus receives almost this exact same answer from a lawyer who had asked Jesus what he must do to be saved. After answering correctly with this summary of the law, the man asks Jesus, "and who is my neighbor?" This leads Jesus to share with us a familiar parable, the parable of the good Samaritan.

We are fairly familiar with this story, a priest, a Levite, and a Samaritan all see a man robbed and left for dead on the road, the first two walk by, the Samaritan stops and helps. The point Jesus makes here is everyone is our neighbor, even the Samaritan that none of the Israelites would otherwise have gotten along with. And what loving thing does he do for his neighbor? He helps him when he is beaten. He pays for his care. He provides him transport to a safe place.

And God's Word has much more to say about the kind of love we should be showing our neighbor. A passage familiar to many as it is often used at weddings, 1 Corinthians 13 tells us quite a bit about the kind of love God expects from his people. And what does that love look like? It is patient and kind. It does not insist on its own way. It is not irritable or resentful, nor does it rejoice at wrong doing. Instead, this love that God describes for us rejoices in the truth. In 1 John we hear more about this love that we are called to. John tells us, "Beloved, let us love one

another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God." 1 John 4:7 The love we are called to show to others is the same love that God has shown to us. It is kind, forgiving, patient, gentle.

So what does it look like for us to love our neighbor as ourselves? It means we see everyone as those created and loved by God. It means we show them the same kindness God has shown us. It means that we think of others as the Samaritan did, not as an other, but as someone in need of our care, our support, our love, and our help.

Jesus takes this love even further. In Matthew 5, Jesus tells us, "I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." Matthew 5:44-45 God gives rain and sun even to the evil and the unjust, and if God sees fit to care for them, then we ought to love them as well.

As we consider the kind of love we have been called to, I want to wrap up with a reminder. As we hear about the love the good Samaritan showed his neighbor, the love described in 1 Corinthians 13 or 1 John 4 and plenty of other places in God's Word, remember this isn't just about the kind of love we should show. It's about the kind of love we have been shown. God in His love sent His Son to die for you, for me, for everyone in this world. He loves us all and as I'm sure you recall from John 3, "gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish". God gives us His love in Christ, He gives us life in Christ. And so dear brothers and sisters, let us show God's love, for he first loved us.

## January 18, 2026, Voters Meeting Recap

Chairman Matt Leitz called the meeting to order, and Pastor had an opening prayer. A motion was made and carried to accept the agenda. The minutes of the previous 10/19/25 meeting were printed out for everyone to read. Motion made and carried to approve the minutes as presented. Treasurer Deanna Sorensen presented the Treasurer's Report for 2025. Motion made and carried to approve the Treasurer's Report. Pastor reported that he attended the IDW Youth Gathering in October and that it went well. There are 10 kids in Catechism class, and one will be confirmed this spring. There will be a couple of weddings this year, and a Baptism was done last week. His Bible studies are continuing Wednesday and Sunday mornings. The Sunday morning class is now meeting upstairs in the LYF room in the hope of attracting more people to attend. Vicar Stacy will finish his classes in June and will be ordained in July, and St. Matthew's is working on Call papers to ask him to be their pastor. St. Paul's will be hosting the Winkel meeting next month, and Pastor has spoken to the LCW regarding serving breakfast and lunch that day. Head Elder Bruce Mohr presented the attendance figures for October, November, and December, as well as the totals for 2025. The phone and internet are getting very expensive, so after looking at other plans, they were planning on keeping the phone through Windstream and getting internet through Longlines. The dead tree in the back of the parsonage has been taken down, as well as some of other trees around town, but the rest will have to wait until the crew comes back in the spring. A large leak was fixed on the roof on the education wing, and the whole roof will have to be redone. The projector is getting old and doesn't work as well as it did, especially on brighter days, and it will be added to the memorial list which is being updated. Tuning of the pianos in the church was also mentioned. A motion was made and carried to approve moving money from the memorial fund. Good comments were received on the Christmas Eve program, and there was a good turnout that night. Thanks were expressed to all who helped, and the Board of Ed is now looking ahead to VBS. Stewardship Secretary Tammy Bramley suggested that undesignated memorial money be used to cover the shortage in last year's IDW Missions and the year-end shortfall in the General Fund. Rick Knuth offered to take care of the \$445.00 IDW Missions shortfall himself. A motion was made and carried that the \$-5,983.47 General Fund shortfall be taken from undesignated memorials. The election ballot was presented on the screen. A motion was made and carried to accept the ballot, pending Ray Holst's acceptance as the Eventide delegate. Council had asked Tammy Bramley to be the church's lay delegate to vote for the Synodical President, and the motion was made and carried. Andy Kuhlmann is willing to be the Camp Okoboji delegate if there were no volunteers, and the motion was made and carried. A special voters meeting will be 2/1/26 to vote on the election ballot, and the next quarterly voters meeting will be 4/19/26. A motion to adjourn was made and carried, and Pastor closed with a prayer.

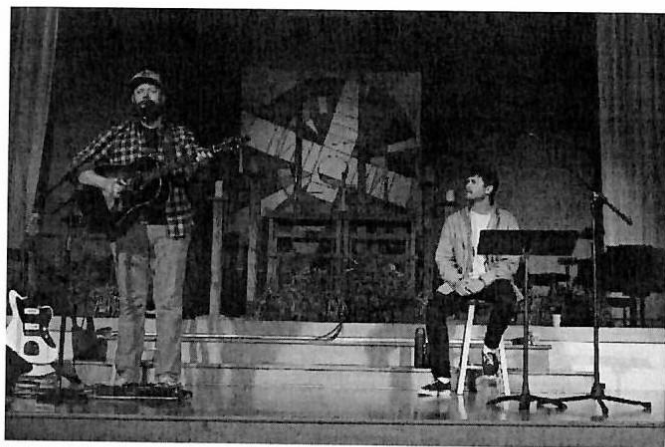

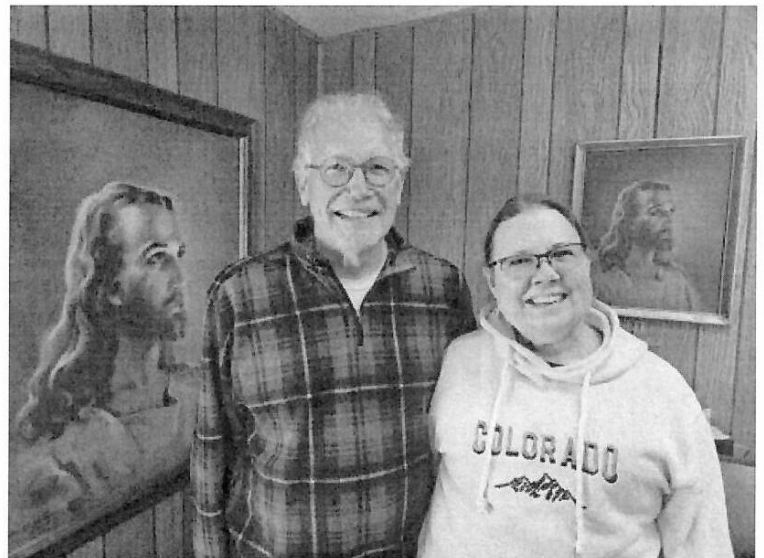
